




Strategic End:


Thailand has continued to prosper conciseness the current conflict and keep up with the changes in the world order

Strategic Ends & Strategic Means






Short-Term

- Solutions to Domestic Conflicts: Leadership with Carefully Determination, Morality and Public Engagement. Professional Team Create: an ad hoc agency with decision-making powers to address urgent economic problems endowned with people, money and knowledge (Whole Cabinet with The Joint Standing Committee on Commerce, Industry and Banking: NGOs/CSOs)
- Accelerate the search for alternative suppliers and markets for Thai products and services. Trade and Investment Facilitations: Unlocking various bottlenecks (Ministry of Commerce, BOI, Thailand Trade Representative: TTR)
- Energy security (both fossil energy and alternative energy) spreading dependence on energy from some countries. Gradually reduce subsidies step by step. (Ministry of Energy, PTT, PTTEP, Bangchak Corp., Thai Oil, Ministry of Finance)
- Build a Strategic Communication Team and Correct Narratives about Thailand. High standard Psychology Operations
 together with Information Operations. (<u>Thai Government Public Relations Department, Ministry of Digital Economy and Society, Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research and Innovation, Ministry of Culture, Private Agency)

- Announcing plans and accelerating the implementation of infrastructure connectivities especially the rail system with neighboring countries and the Economic Corridor, connecting SEZ with the central part and with neighboring countries (Economic Cabinet, Ministry of Transport, Eastern Economic Corridor Office of Thailand (EECO), BOI, NESDB, together with Private sectors)
- Develop "Soft Power Strategy" to create "Friend of Thailand" (Public Diplomacy) to build support for Thailand on the world stage especially in the people in superpower nations and neighboring countries. (Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Commerce, Ministry of Culture, Ministry of Defense)
- Strategic Formulation for New South-South Cooperation with emerging economies (Ministry of Foreign Affairs + Economic Cabinet)
- Strategic Formulation for Balancing/Hedging Superpowers and Position Thailand as a Friendly Middle Power (<u>Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Defense</u>)

Medium-Term

- Accelerate the negotiation of trade agreements at 3 levels (<u>Ministry of</u>
 <u>Commerce, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Industry</u>)
 - FTA 2.0 with CPTPP, EU, EFTA, EaEU, UK, US using RCEP model
 - FTA 1.0 with emerging markets, South Asia (India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Pakistan), Africa (Nami Bia, Guinea, Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanzania) Middle East (Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Iran)
