Background

Pursuant to guidance from the Chief of Defence, Thailand, the Strategic Studies Center (SSC), National Defence Studies Institute, and the Daniel K. Inouye Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies (DKI APCSS), are partnering to conduct the inaugural Senior Security Studies Course focused on strategic thinking and context setting, traditional, non-traditional and emerging security issues, and the implications for Thailand.

Course Description / Methodology

This is an intensive, one-week program for senior Thai security sector leaders on the upward track for positions of significant national and international responsibility. The course will look at a comprehensive array of emergent and over-the-horizon security issues such as: terrorism, environmental degradation, geopolitical competition, cyber threats, and regional governance. The course will also consider geo-strategic issues such as power shifts among nations as part of the context in which broader security concerns play out. Senior Participants will utilize strategic thinking and consider cooperative interagency responses to transnational security scenarios during an interactive exercise. The program is based on the broad notion that national and regional security is significantly enhanced by collaborative efforts at monitoring, preventing, and preparing for any transnational security threat.

The curriculum emphasizes the impact of change in the region, as well as capacities to manage change leader and institutional. The course integrates a challenging program of interactive presentations and dialogue, together with opportunities to specifically consider the implications for Thailand and recommend practical, actionable responses.

The course typically caters to senior executives from varied ministries and organizations throughout the government of Thailand, as well as officials from non-governmental, regional and international organizations with security-related portfolios. Typical peer level ranks include ambassador/deputy minister, flag-general rank military officers, and regional directors. This unique education and networking opportunity mostly benefits senior leaders whose responsibilities require influencing or making decisions within multilateral, multinational, and whole-of-government forums.

Course Outcomes

- Participants with broadened perspectives on, and deepened understanding of, contemporary and future, domestic and regional, security challenges and opportunities.
- Participant-developed initial thoughts on areas for enhanced Government of Thailand and Royal Thai Armed Forces focus.
- A networked cohort of participants with shared understanding of each other's organizations and plans.
- A foundation for SSC to continue developing its role as a premier host and facilitator for executive education in support of Royal Thai Armed Forces and Government of Thailand priorities.

Prior to enlisting in the Army, Col. Leffler worked in Vietnam as a management consultant and English teacher. After commissioning through the U.S. Army Officer Candidate School in 1997, he served as a tactical military intelligence officer in the Republic of Korea and at Ft. Bragg, North Carolina, where he commanded a headquarters company in U.S. Army Special Operations Command. He also served as a member of the U.S. contingent to International Forces East Timor (INTERFET). He was then assigned to Special Operations Command-Pacific in Hawaii. From Hawaii, he also served as a member of the U.S. Joint Special Operations Task Force in Zamboanga, Philippines.

Col. Leffler was then selected as a Foreign Area Officer (FAO) and attended the Malaysian Armed Forces Staff College in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, after which he was assigned as Director of Plans and Policy for the Joint U.S. Military Advisory Group (JUSMAGTHAI) at the U.S. Embassy in Bangkok, Thailand. After leaving Bangkok, he served as Theater Foreign Military Financing (FMF) Manager in the Security Cooperation Division at U.S. Indo-Pacific Command (INDOPACOM) in Honolulu, Hawaii. He was then selected to serve as Military Advisor to the Ambassador, U.S. Mission to ASEAN (USASEAN) in Jakarta, Indonesia.

After returning to the U.S., Col. Leffler worked in the Headquarters, Department of the Army (HQDA)'s Senior Leader Development Office, where he was the Human Resource Manager for FAO colonels worldwide. He was then selected for Senior Service College, which he completed at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) in Washington, DC as a Chief of Staff of the Army Senior Army Fellow from Army War College. Presently, he is the Army Attaché in Islamabad, Pakistan

He has a Master's degree in Southeast Asia Studies from Ohio University, a Bachelor's in International Relations from The Ohio State University, an Associate's in Thai Language from the Defense Language Institute, and a Postgraduate Diploma in Strategic Studies from the University of Malaya in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. He has studied the Thai, Indonesian, Urdu, and Vietnamese languages.

He has received various decorations and awards, including the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary and Service Medals, the Korea Defense Service Medal, the Army Staff Badge, and the Senior Parachutist Badge.

Col. Leffler is a native of Ohio and has a daughter, who is also a U.S. Army officer, and a son.

Dr. Anuson Chinvanno is a Sinologist by training and a diplomat by career. He received a D.Phil. in International Relations from Oxford University in 1988, publishing his thesis with Macmillan under the title "Thailand's Policies towards China, 1949 - 1954". He joined the Ministry in 1988, rising to the rank of Consul-General to Shanghai in 2004. He was Director-General of the Department of East Asian Affairs (2006-2009) and the Department of International Organizations (2009 - 2010). He then served as Thailand's Ambassador to Vietnam between 2011-2013 before becoming Deputy Secretary-General to Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha between 2014–2019. He returned to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to head the revitalized International Studies Center (ISC) from 1 August 2019

Strategic Thinking in Complex Security Environments

Dr. Alexander Vuving

Overview

Complex security environments are characterized by the continual change of its powerful currents, the multimindedness of its actors, and the interdependence of its parts.

Strategic thinking in a complex security environment is the art of getting what you want, knowing that others are also trying to get what they want, that the environment is changing, and that almost everything in the environment is interdependent.

Strategic thinking is a mindset that (1) persists with an ultimate end but is flexible in terms of the ways, means, and intermediate goals to achieve the end, (2) always keeps the big picture in mind, (3) takes the long view, (4) embraces systems thinking, (5) espouses critical thinking, (6) is creative, and (7) is highly adaptive.

The lecture will illustrate these points with case studies related to the global strategic environment and the Ukraine conflict.

Objectives

- Understand the characteristics of complex security environments,
- Understand the concept of strategic thinking,
- Understand the key dimensions of strategic thinking in complex security environments.

GEN Jumphon Chalerytoy was born in 1959. He graduated from the Chulachomkiao Royal Military Academy and joined the Royal Army in 1982 as an artillery officer. During his early life as a young artillery officer, he had served in several units both combat and education units.

From 1982 to 1995, his first commission as Field Artillery Forward Observer in the 8th Field Artillery Battalion of the 3rd Infantry Division, in the northeastern part of Thailand. He also enjoyed his position as an artillery instructor at the Artillery School, Artillery Center, Lopburi province before being assigned to the Light Infantry Division as the 9th Artillery Regiment S3, 19th Battalion XO, and Coordination Officer of the 9th Arty Regiment, before posting at the military units out of artillery corp, both the Royal Thai Army and the Royal Thai Armed Forces HQs.

At the Policy and Plans Office, Directorate of Joint Operation, he was appointed as the Director of Policy and Strategy Division, and subsequently Deputy Director of Policy and Plans Office, before promoting to Major General as Staff Officer to the Chief of Defence Forces in 2012.

Under the RTARF HQs, in 2014, he was assigned as a Director of School of Interdisciplinary Security Studies, National Defence College, National Defence Studies Institute. Then, in 2015, he served as Director of Strategic Studies Center (SSC), known as the 'Defence Think-Tank' organization, which providing strategic and security viewpoints and suggestions to the the RTARF HQs and government agencies.

In 2016, he was promoted to 3star General as Adviser to the RTARF HQs. During two years onwards, he was assigned to supervise to the National Defence College and subsequently to the office of the Chief of Defence Forces. At his final year, he was promoted to 4-star General as Supervisor to National Defence Studies Institute, and working until the end of September 2019.

During his jobs at the headquarters, he had been very much involved with the national and military strategic development from military level up to government level.

He had been posted as the operation officer of the Surasi Task Forces, at the Thai-Burmese Border between 1992 and 1995.
